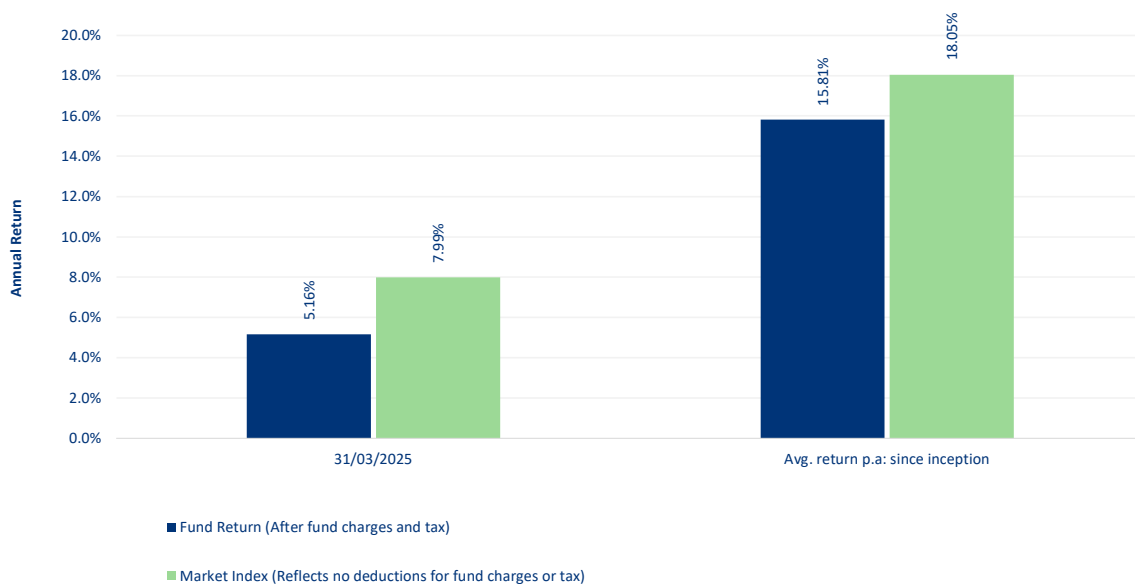

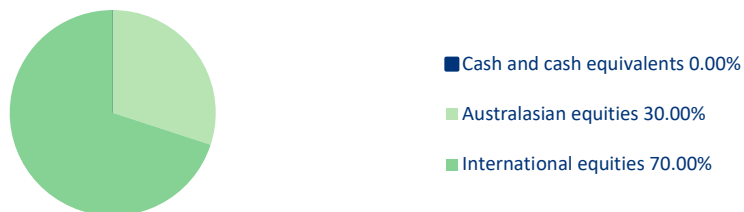

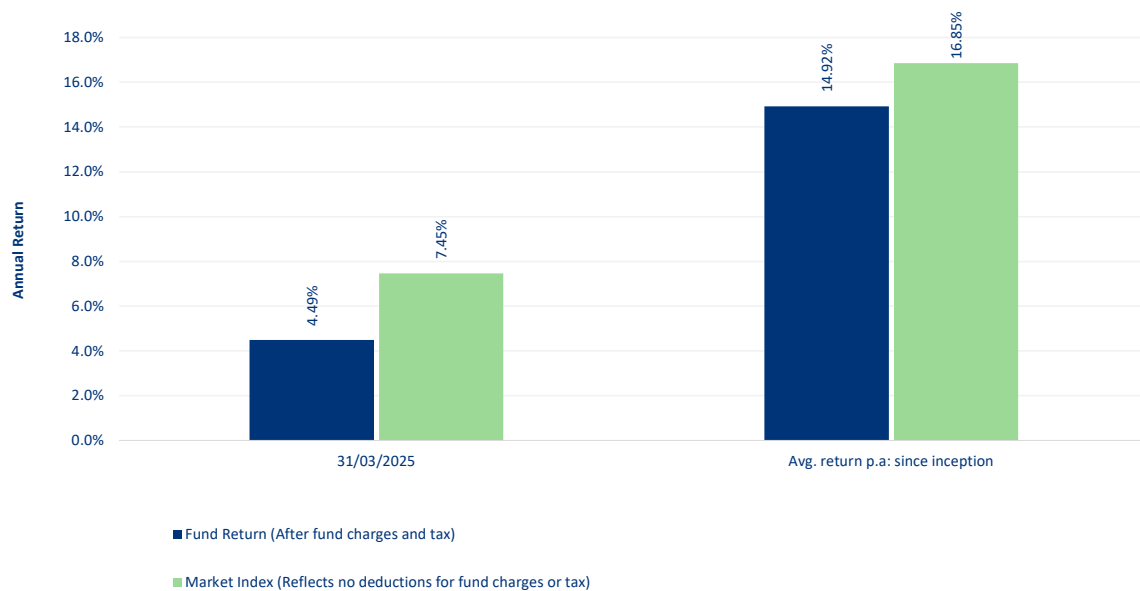

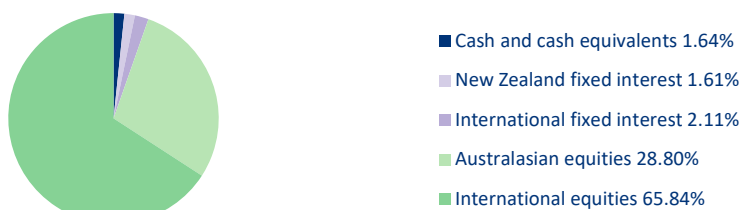

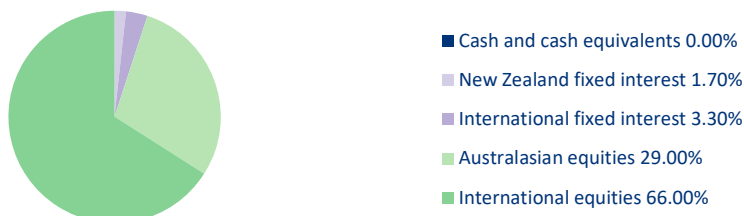
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

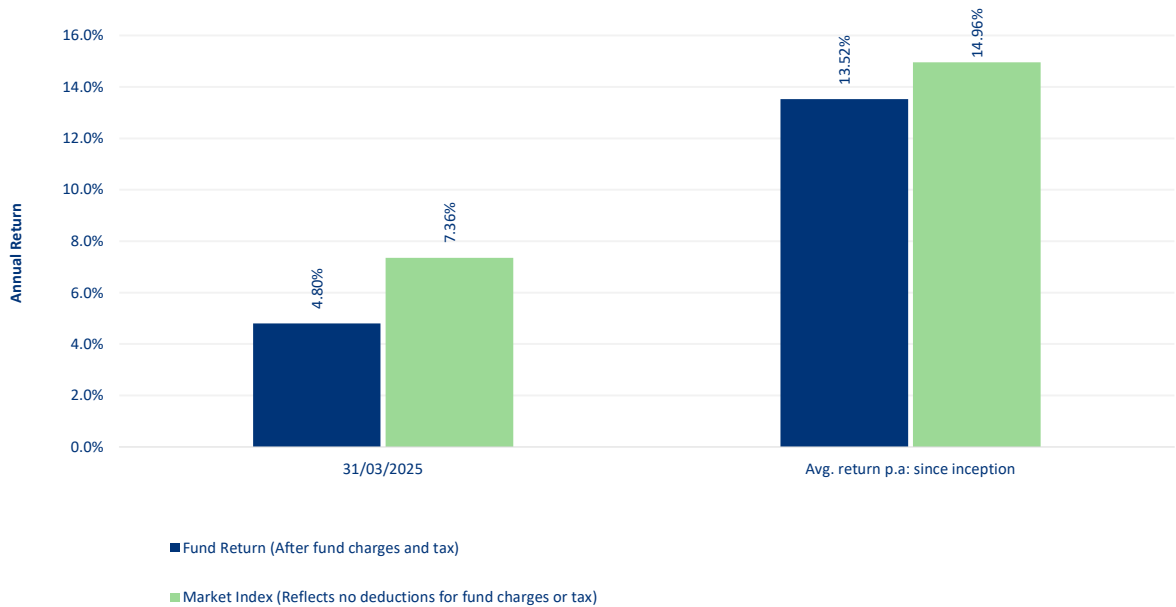

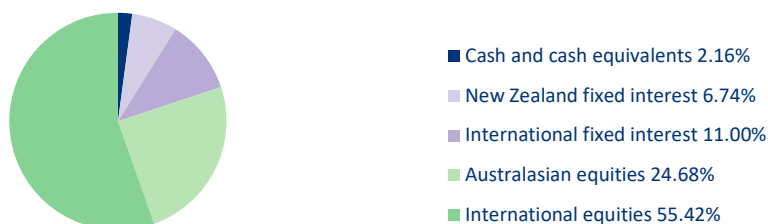

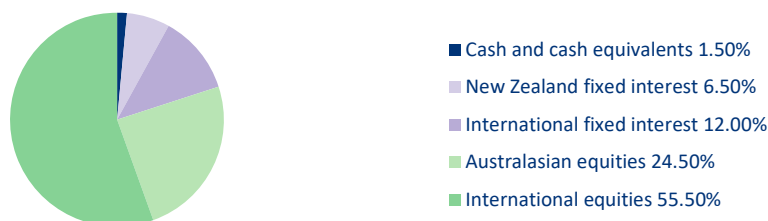

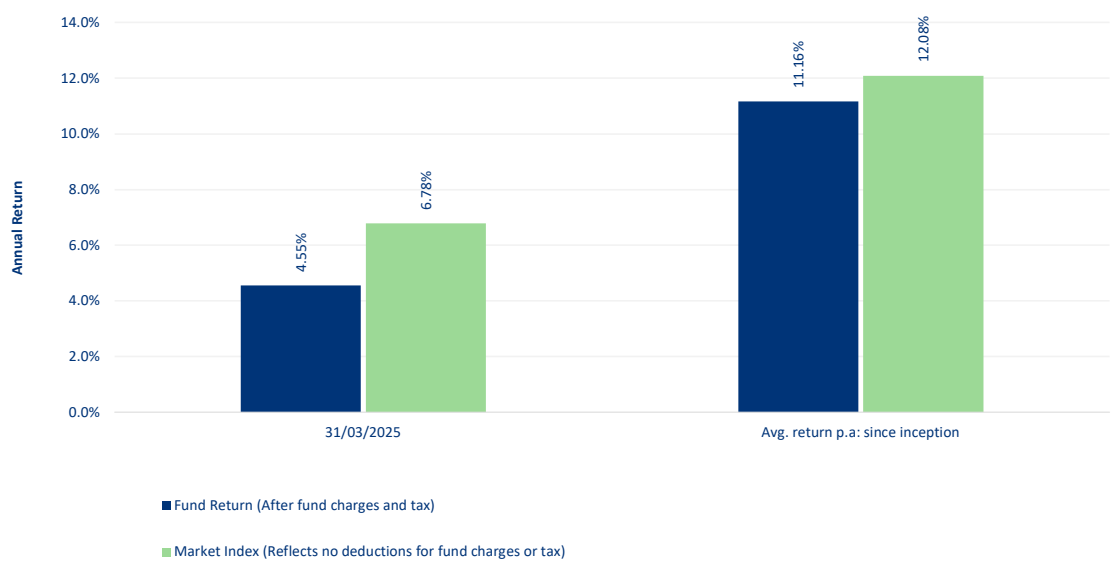

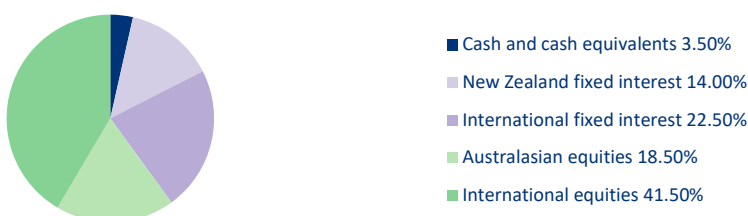

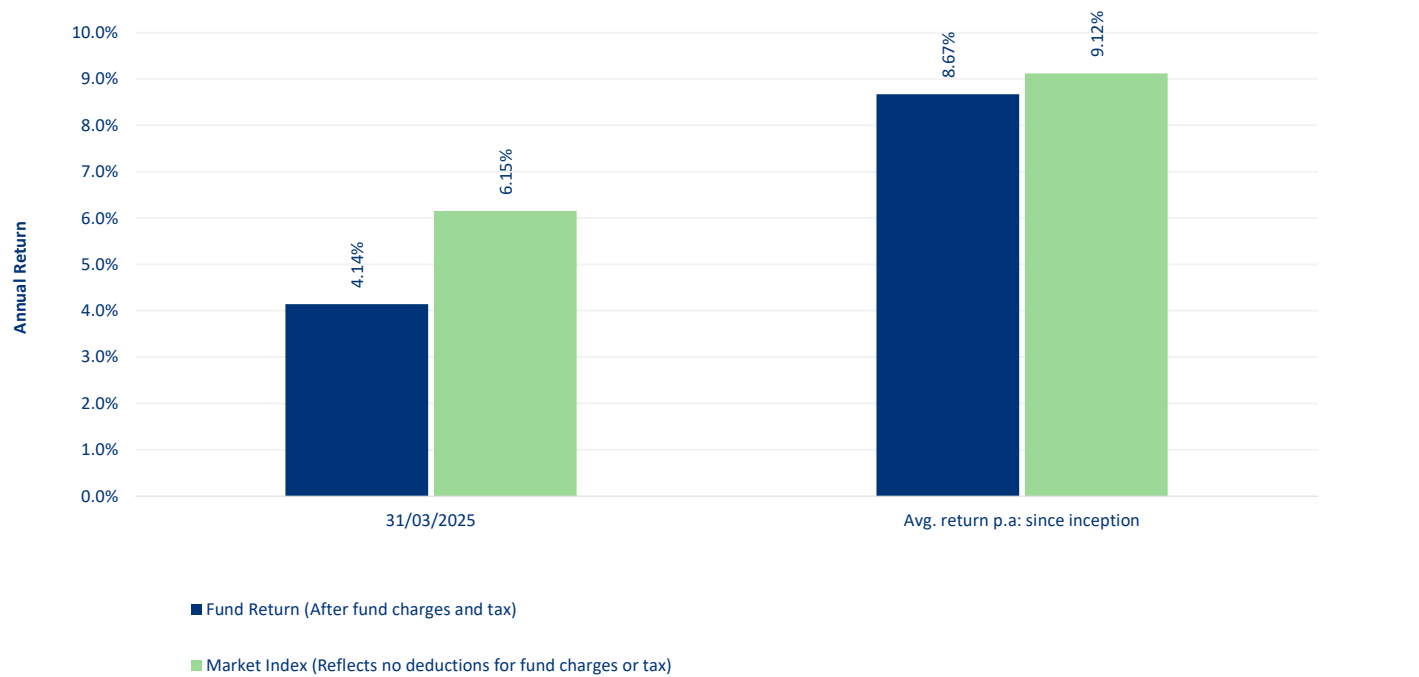

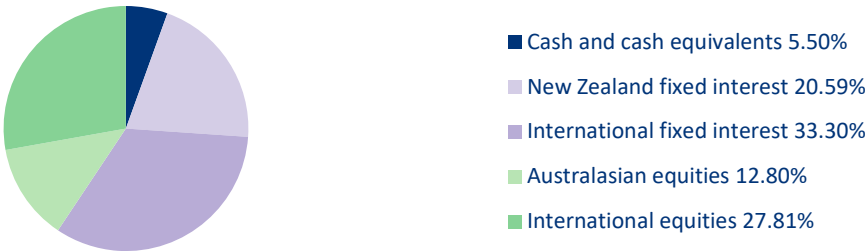

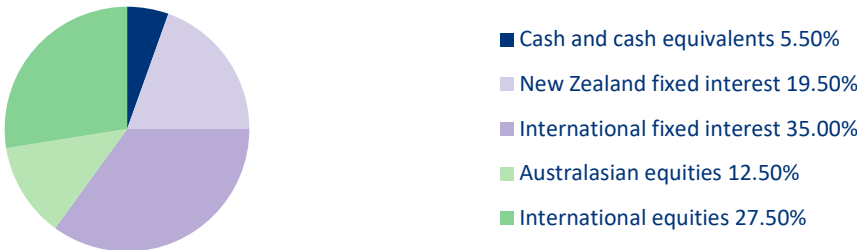
This shows the types of assets that the fund invests in.

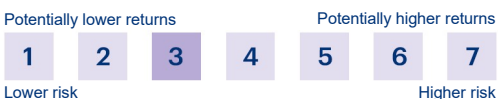

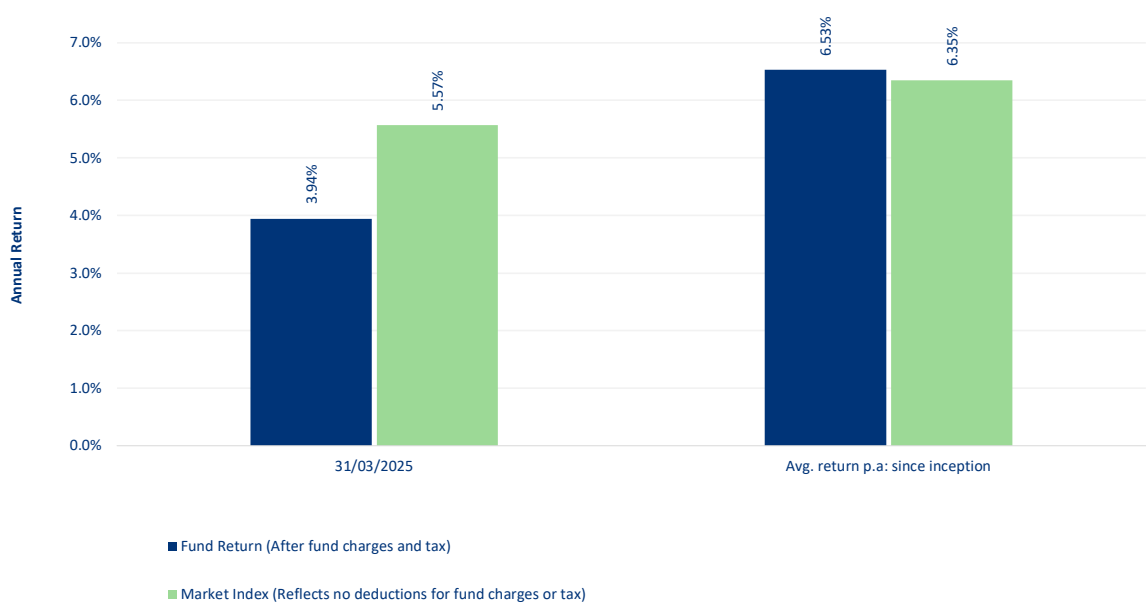

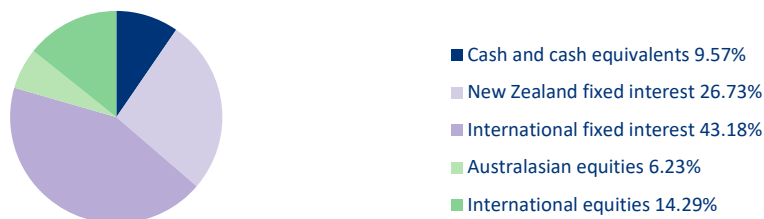

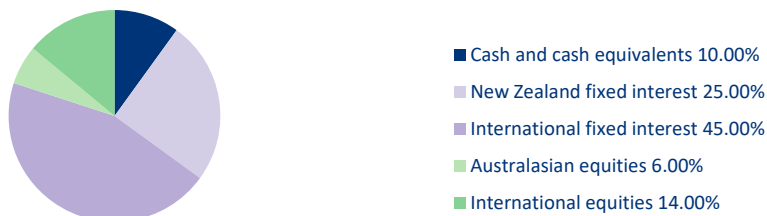

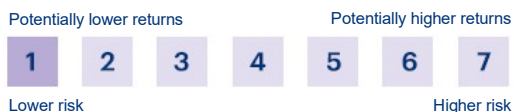

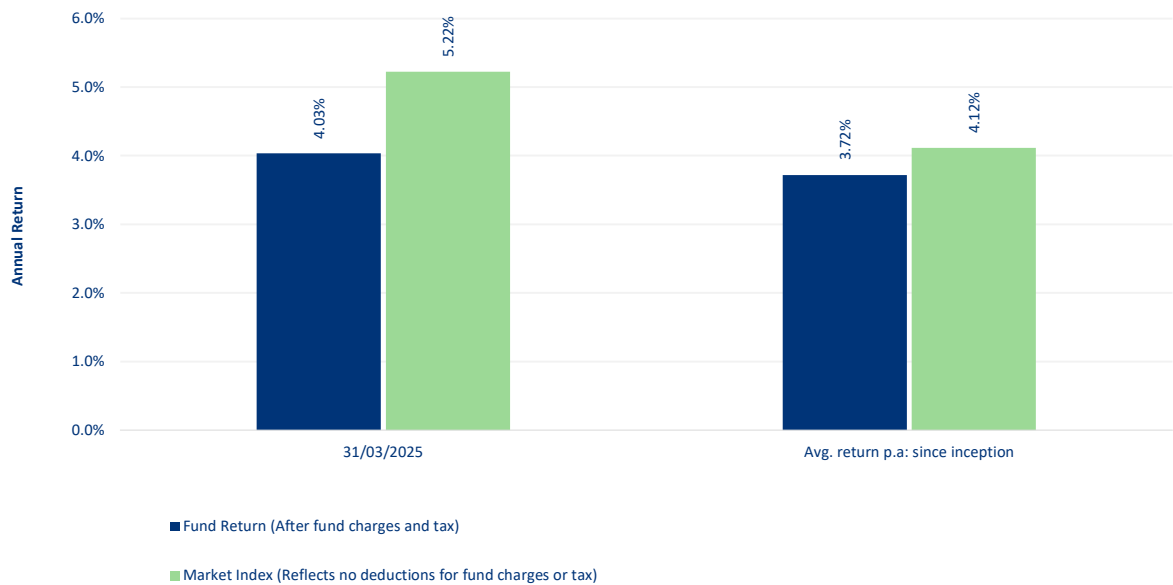
